Little Thinkers Series is written by philosopher and educator Özge Özdemir, who is inspired by the Philosophy for Children (P4C) method. which aims to activate children's reasoning and conceptualization skills at a young age. The series is based on the principle that starting the learning journey by understanding, not memorizing, paves the way for further learning and focuses on the concepts in the preschool education program.

Gökçe Akgül adds a visually original quality to this invitation with his entertaining drawings, in which he walks the characters through the pages.

HEAVY AS A ROCK, LIGHT AS A LEAF

The concepts in this book are both heavy and light. The characters are looking for answers to questions like, "What is heavy and light? How do we decide whether a thing is light or heavy?"

Theme: Concepts, Reasoning, Heavy-Light

I COUNT MANY, I MEASURE FEW

The book focuses on the concepts of few and many. The characters exchange ideas about how quantities of things are measured. They are looking for answers to questions like, "What is less and more? How do we determine whether something is more or less?"

Theme: Concepts, Reasoning, Many-Few

A SMALL DOT, A BIG ELEPHANT

In this book, the characters ask, "What is small and big?" and they invite us to think about the fact that we make comparisons when we describe something as small or big.

Theme: Concepts, Philosophy, Reasoning, Small-Big

A FAR MOUNTAIN, A CLOSE ADVENTURE

The book focuses on "What is far and close?" It invites us to reflect and inquire about being far or close in space, time, and emotion.

After graduating from the Philosophy Department of Boğaziçi University, Özge Özdemir completed her master's and doctoral degree in the Philosophy Department of Istanbul University. She worked as a lecturer at various universities in Istanbul. The Octopus and the Silent Whale is a story written with the inspiration the author got from a true story of a whale who sings at a frequency other whales can't understand. In 1992, scientists discovered this whale's voice. Due to his voice's different frequency (he sings at 52 Hertz), it was impossible for him to communicate with other whales. So, scientists gave him the name "52 Hertz Whale" and thought that he was the loneliest whale in the world. But in literature, nothing lasts forever, everything can change and find a new way to exist. Also, life has miracles and a thousand ways of living. So, can this whale find a friend in the deep ocean too? Gökce Gökceer offers a new ending to this whale's story and award-winning illustrator Uğur Altun takes us to the very deep waters of the ocean with his powerful colors and illustrations.



Uğur Altun was born in Rize in 1987. He graduated from the Department of Graphic Design at Bilkent University with a merit scholarship in 2012. Since 2013, he has received distinction awards and honorable mentions from GMK (Turkish Graphic Designers Association), Taiwan International Graphic Design Awards, and Sharjah Children's Books Illustrations Exhibition. Editorial Illustrations he illustrated for Sabitfikir magazine received the bronze award from the SilkRoad Spirit Biennial in China. In this title, children debate about the concepts such as dispute, war, peace, finding solutions, revenge, and reconciliation.

IS IT POSSIBLE NOT TO GET ANGRY?

When Miss Ipek opens the discussion with the question "When and why do people get angry?", everyone has lots of things to say and they start debating eagerly.

CAN YOU ESCAPE ANXIETY?
